Discussion of the future plans for the 419 corridor from Grandin Road to Keagy Road.

Wayne Leftwich highlighted the City Plan 2040

Housing, infrastructure and public facilities with emphasis on equity, public health and regional opportunities. He presented several theme concepts including livability, nature, jobs and equity. There will be working groups meeting at libraries during November-March. Information can be obtained at PlanRoanoke.org. Highlights: complete neighborhoods, housing options, schools, parks, walk ability and bike ability, better access to resources and revitalize aging and failed facilities.

Bailey Howard-Dubois highlighted Oak Grove Center Plan.

Highlighted Emphasis: walk ability, bike ability, and connection to greenway, expansion of parks and recreation, improve 419 traffic and pedestrian crossings, commercial building upgrades and streetscaping. The Oak Grove Center would include public outdoor seating, flex space, accessible spaces, private outdoor dining, water features and public art. An expansion of Oak Grove Park was also recommended.
