Court To Appoint City Council Member

The Roanoke City Council has been unable to agree upon the appointment of the vacant city council seat after interviewing the 3 candidates: Evelyn Powers, Trish White-Boyd and Kathy Cohen. You may ask - why did they not hold a special election? Unfortunately, a special election cannot be called if there are less than 2 years on the term (which expires December 31, 2026). The Circuit Court Judge (James Swanson) will work with his 4 colleagues to make the appointment sooner than later. Roanoke Rambler article. Cardinal News article. Did You Know?

Did you know that there are 5 private cemeteries within Greater Deyerle - a few that date back to the 1800s.

- 1. Barnhardt Cemetery Mt. Holland Rd (1833-1921). This is the largest with at least 39 graves (including 19 marked with inscribed headstones) enclosed by an ornate iron fence.
- 2. Logan Cemetery Glen Heather Drive (1952) 8 gravesites
- 3. Unknown Cemetery Glen Heather Drive
- 4. Lewis & Eleanor Shepherd Cemetery Belford Street (1867) 2 gravestones
